The Use and Perception of Religious Cult Buildings in Ancient (City/Polis) Sanctuaries

Monumental cult buildings constitute one of the most important architectural features of ancient cultures. As such, they have the potential to significantly dominate the ancient cityscape. At the same time, they are important places of worship and closely integrated into ritual practices.

This interdisciplinary colloquium explores the use of enclosed, roofed cult buildings (temples) in ancient societies and their significance within the context of ritual and social practices in urban settings.

With its wide geographical and chronological framework, the colloquium tries to grasp the specific problem of dealing with enclosed cult buildings, usually called temples, in all their diversity.
